

## Muckraker Project

Overview: You are going to focus on one issue in United States society that Progressives sought to reform. You will research that issue and then create a piece of “muckraker” journalism highlighting the problems and the need for reform.

Your project will have two parts:

1. **Essential information:** After you research your topic, you will give a brief overview of what happened to this issue during the Progressive Era.
  - a. Answer ALL of the following questions in approximately one paragraph each:
    1. What was the issue, and how was it exposed?
    2. Who were main people/groups involved in addressing the issue? How did they address it? What were their goals?
    3. What were the effects of this progressive movement? (Was the issue resolved? Are the reforms still in effect today? If not, when and why they were undone?)
  - b. You do not need in-text citations for this. You should paraphrase what you are researching *in your own words* and include a bibliography page at the end.
2. **Muckraker-style journalism:** Using research, create a piece of journalism exposing a progressive-era issue. (This is in the voice of someone living *during the Progressive Era.*)

a. For this, choose ONE of the following options:

<u>Option 1:</u> Write one long newspaper article (5-6 paragraphs)	<u>Option 2:</u> Create a political cartoon AND write one short newspaper article (2-3 paragraphs)
