 - Please focus your research between 600 BCE and 600 CE, which sometimes means you'll be switching back and forth between these two time periods
 - Make sure that you check the dates that are listed under each society, and choose the corresponding dates on time period. This can get confusing, so try to problem-solve on your own or with a peer before you email me about it.
